I am privileged and excited take over the leadership of SSE Renewables at a pivotal point in time for Ireland's renewable energy ambitions. In SSE Renewables, we are proud to be pioneers in renewable power in Ireland, and we are committed to continuing to invest in the clean energy infrastructure we need to achieve a net zero future. Since the administration of our first community benefit fund in Ireland in 2003 we have grown to now administering over 20 community funds annually with a value of €1m per year, and this will increase significantly over coming years. It is inspiring to see our funding help bring to life so many important and innovative community projects. I commend everyone involved in these transformational initiatives which our increasing the sustainability of regions all over Ireland, and enhancing the social capital of local places. The principle of sharing the economic value of renewables projects with local communities is one which we are committed to, and we look forward to continuing to work together to deliver on community aspiration and maximise the local benefits of Ireland's renewable energy revolution.


Our community benefit funds continue to show the resilience of communities and their abilities to successfully respond to emerging priorities including the climate emergency. In 2021/22 16% of the funding went to climate action projects and it is inspiring to see communities reacting to the emergency by installing modern technologies and measures to lower energy costs and reduce fuel consumption. The funds show how the small actions of each individual project can help make a collective impact on climate change.

SSE Renewables is in a period of growth and our new sites will help contribute to Ireland's 2030 renewable energy targets. I am delighted that development works are ongoing at our first ever offshore wind farm in Ireland, Arklow Bank Wind Park Phase 2 of the coastline in County Wicklow. The project will have a power generation capacity of up to 800MW and make a significant contribution to Ireland's climate action target of at least 5GW by 2030 with delivery expected in 2028. Construction has already commenced at the onshore Lenalea Wind Farm, a co-development with FuturEnergy Ireland, and in line with the RESS requirements, a community consultation will commence in September to allow the local community to shape the community benefit fund. These new sites will allow our community funding in Ireland to increase significantly in the coming years and we look forward to helping communities achieve their ambition.



2021/22 has been a busy year for SSE Renewables in Ireland. As the ambition of the country to tackle the climate emergency increases, we are pleased that working responsibly in communities remains at the centre of the renewable industry. We have focused on supporting the introduction of the Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS) while also ensuring the existing funds continue to deliver impact to local communities. **Our key priorities of the last year included:**

Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS) - the Government introduced mandatory community benefit funds set at €2/MWh for all generation projects successful under RESS. The funds must be used for the wider economic, environmental, social and cultural well-being of the local community. The community benefit funds under the first RESS auction will deliver close to €4million a year to sustainable community initiatives targeted at those communities living in close proximity to the RESS projects.

Pandemic recovery – the impact of the pandemic continued to affect communities in the last year. The support they needed from the community funds changed with an increased focus on how communities could re-open safely including requests for increased hand sanitisation equipment.

Listening to feedback – for community funds to be successful we need to continually seek the views of both community members and community groups. In 2021/22 we completed a survey for the Galway Wind Park Community Funds to ensure they continued to meet local needs. A total of 49 responses were received and the overall the response was extremely positive. We are pleased the findings showed the funding makes a significant difference for small community groups and that 93% of recipients agreed with funding priorities for the Major Projects Fund. The survey highlighted local people want linguistic and cultural heritage to be a focus of the funds and it has now been included as key funding criteria for the funds.

2022/23 priorities

Supporting a net zero future – Irish communities are taking action in the climate emergency. We will ensure that the funds are available to support community groups and assets to become less reliant on carbon. We will share best practice across communities so they can learn from each other.

Tackling the cost of living – there have been unprecedented challenges on community finances over the past year. The community funds will work with communities and support projects that make a long-term impact on reducing costs for communities, in particular energy efficiency measures.

New wind farms – The community investment team will continue to develop the community funds for Lenalea Wind Farm, Yellow River Wind Farm and Arklow Bank Wind Park Phase 2. The Lenalea community consultation will begin in Autumn 2022 and will enable the local community to identify what the fund priorities should be.

Improved reporting – The size and scale of community funds is increasing. To ensure the impact and value of the funds is robustly captured we will develop a new digital reporting framework which will ensure we meet the reporting needs of both communities and joint venture partners.

Galway Wind Park



€373,000 awarded in 2021/22

The 174MW Galway Wind Park, co-owned by SSE Renewables and Greencoat Renewables, in Connemara's Cloosh Valley, is Ireland's largest and best performing onshore wind farm. Its associated Galway Wind Park Community Fund is the largest community benefit fund on the island of Ireland. The Galway Community Fund has three components:

Galway Local Fund

Supporting communities nearest to the wind park to develop projects focused on energy efficiency, safety, environmental sustainability, social sustainability, recreation and tourism, and education and skills development.

Galway Major Project Fund

Supporting large-scale transformational projects.

Scholarship Fund

Supporting local students to achieve success in further education.

2021/22 has been a busy year for the Galway Community Fund. Local projects were supported as they continued to deal with the impact of the pandemic. There was increased demand for scholarships with students in more need than ever for support. The major projects funded in March 2021 have been supported to complete construction work and now provide assets the communities can utilise for years to come.


Supporting inclusive experiences

Irish Community Air Ambulance

Sustaining rural emergency services

A common area of focus for the communities benefiting from wind farm funds is how to maintain vital services within rural settings. A key concern for community members is ensuring that they can access expert support during times of an emergency, and this is evidenced by €10,500 funding to the volunteer-run Irish Community Air Ambulance. The service is an integral part of Ireland's frontline emergency response network, responding to 500 incidents a year.

Helping the pandemic recovery

Supporting local communities during the pandemic remained a key priority for the community funds during 2021/22. The support that communities needed changed this year and moved from emergency responses to enabling the communities to re-open safely.

Key community assets were able to re-open but with enhanced safety measures and the community funds helped to ensure this happened. Dunmanway Hall received €2,000 funding after being closed for 18 months. The funding helped them to instal new sanitisation equipment and pay for the water expenses needed for the increased hygiene measures at the site. Since re-opening the hall has safely welcomed up to 500 people a week and supported the improved health and well-being of local residents.

"Our hall is used by all ages in the community. It is a place where people come to socialise, exercise, learn and connect. It is a vital resource for many in the community mentally and physically which was missed so much during covid. We are delighted to open the hall to the public again and this grant has allowed us to put the correct measures in place to keep the most vulnerable in our community protected and people feel safe using our premises."

Achieving a net zero future

The world is facing a climate emergency and many communities are looking towards activity which reduces their carbon footprint. Tournafulla Sustainable Living is an exemplary project on the achievable steps communities can successfully take. The project has established a community living garden which enables local people to grow and eat locally grown produce and reduces the carbon impact of food. The project received €5,000 to introduce renewable energy to the site to further reduce their carbon contribution. The new solar panels not only help provide a more sustainable watering system for the site, but they also enabled improved lighting to be used which has allowed the site to be used by community members during the winter months.

"With the rise in living costs and the impact of covid on fundraising facilities, the installation of solar panels will help to reduce utility bills in the centre all the while reducing our carbon footprint."
