INTRODUCTION TO THE SSE RENEWABLES COMMUNITY FUND

SSE Renewables is Ireland’s largest generator of wind power and and is the power behind leading green energy provider and sister company SSE Airtricity. The company provides voluntary community funding from its wind farms in support of energy efficiency, safety and sustainability projects. This funding is awarded to community groups near SSE Renewables’ wind farms in Ireland and Galway Wind Park which is a joint venture with Greencoat Renewables. The Galway Wind Park Community Fund was launched in 2018 and, at around €400,000 annually, is the largest community fund of its kind in Ireland.

Through its annual Community Fund programme, SSE Renewables has awarded €8.9m so far to over 3,200 community projects in the communities closest to its wind farms. This funding has helped support local groups, sports organisations and schools among others to develop their facilities with energy efficiency and sustainability upgrades as well as social and environmental projects that enable community development.

This year marks a change in the name of the funding programme. Previously promoted under the SSE Airtricity brand, the programme will now be known as the SSE Renewables Community Fund. The change is designed to better link annual funding award payments from SSE’s wind farms across Ireland to SSE Renewables, which owns and operates each of the company’s wind farm sites with the exception of our community fund for Galway Wind Park which is a joint venture with Greencoat Renewables.

SSE Renewables is committed to supporting Ireland to achieve this.

As we look forward to 2021, we will support Ireland’s green recovery with the continued development of projects both on and offshore, including Arklow Bank Wind Park, Phase 2, the first of the next generation of offshore wind energy sites in Ireland. We are delighted to have commenced construction of the onshore Lenalea Wind Farm in Co. Donegal. This project will play a key role in advancing the transition to a zero-carbon future and meeting Ireland’s climate action goals. We look forward to working with our co-development partners Coillte Renewable Energy and local Donegal communities to realise the positive social and economic benefits that Lenalea Wind Farm will deliver, both during construction and throughout its operational lifetime.

SSE has shown how serious we are about fulfilling our purpose to build a better world of energy by being a lead sponsor of the 26th UN Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26) summit in Glasgow. The summit will provide a global stage to showcase the work we have done to provide clean energy to millions of homes. We are putting ourselves on the front line of climate change and supporting the summit as it sets a clear framework for a truly just transition to net zero.





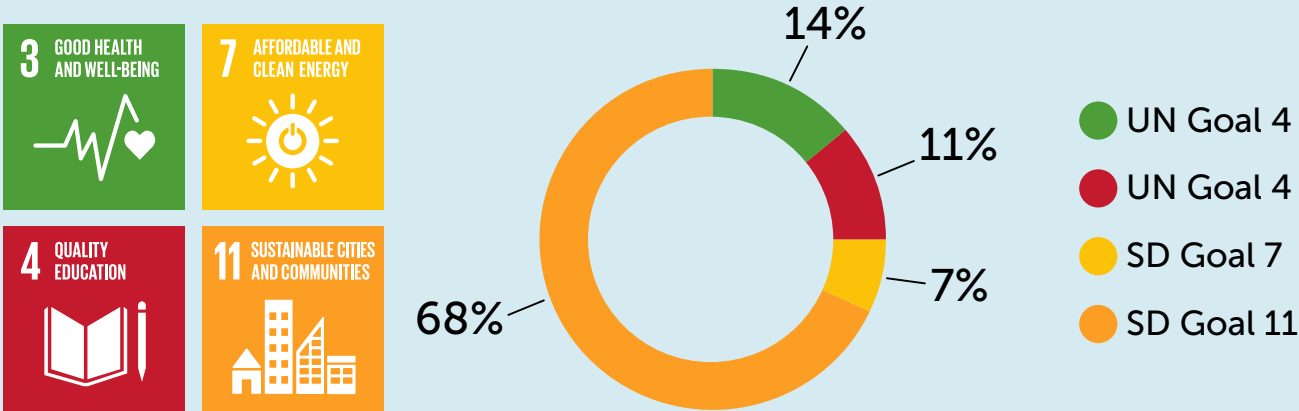

SUPPORTING THE UN SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS



2020/21 has been a unique and challenging year. The coronavirus pandemic has impacted every Irish community and helping communities during the crisis has been the central focus for our funds during the last year. SSE Renewables quickly recognised that the funds we operate could play an important part in community responses to the pandemic. We took the decision in Spring 2020 to release the funding for all our local Ireland wind farm funds early so that it was available for the community initiatives. Over €350,000 was distributed within six months to help local coronavirus responses.

Despite the challenges of the pandemic we have worked to ensure that other priorities have not been delayed. In January 2021 we launched the second round of the Galway Major Project Fund which will support transformational projects within 10km of Galway Wind Park. We have operated our established scholarship programmes to ensure young people have the best start in life.

We have implemented a new approach for demonstrating how the community funds make a difference. The UN Sustainable Development Goals provide a blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. SSE Renewables recognise the value of the goals in measuring the impact of our community benefit and have integrated the goals into our fund priorities and evaluation approach. 2021/22 priorities

Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS) – we are committed to helping Ireland achieve ambitious climate targets. Our approach supports the growth of the green economy and commits to sharing the benefit with local communities. In line with RESS Good Practice Guidelines we will enhance and develop our community benefit policy and commitments.

Lenalea Wind Farm – Lenalea received the green light for development and construction after it won a 15-year contract for low carbon power in the first round of the Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS1), Ireland’s first competitive auction for onshore wind. The Donegal wind farm is a co-development project with Coillte Renewable Energy. The wind farm entered construction in 2021 and aims to be operational by 2023. Local consultation will be completed in the next year to determine the priorities and focus of the community fund.

Pandemic Recovery – the annual wind farm local community funds will revert to their original timeframes but will be available to support communities as they recover from the impact of the pandemic.

Arklow Bank Wind Park – Arklow Bank Wind Park Phase 2 will be located in the Irish Sea off the coast of Arklow, Co. Wicklow. The 520MW offshore wind project is the next phase of wind energy development at the Arklow Bank. By 2025, SSE Renewables intends to install up to 62 turbines, with the ability to power almost 450,000 homes annually and offset over half a million tonnes of carbon emissions each year. Consultation with communities and key stakeholders is ongoing on the project.

ENHANCING COMMUNITY INVESTMENT

SSE Renewables is committed to being a leader in delivering impactful community benefit funds. The publication of the Renewable Electricity Support Scheme (RESS) Good Practice Guidelines is welcomed and will enable the enhancement of our approach to work with local communities.

INVESTING IN YOUNG PEOPLE

Young people are one of the generations most impacted by the pandemic with the cancelling of exams and a reduction in job opportunities. The challenges facing school leavers was at the forefront when the Galway Wind Park (GWP) Scholarship Fund was launched in October 2020. The fund enabled 19 young people located within 10km of the Galway Wind Park, our joint venture with Greencoat Renewables, to benefit from a life changing investment in their future.

The scholarship programme helps local students with their student fees and living expenses whilst creating a pool of well-trained and experienced professionals, transforming career prospects in regional communities and positively impacting future generations. The Scholarship supports students attending Galway-Mayo Institute of Technology (GMIT) and National University of Ireland (NUI) Galway as well as other educational institutions across the island of Ireland.



Robert Naughton is a student at NUI Galway and was the recipient of a 2020 GWP Scholarship Programme. Robert has provided an insight into the impact of learning during the pandemic and how the scholarship has changed his university experience.

Hi Robert, what course are you studying?

Hi there, I have just finished the fourth and final year of my BSc in Biotechnology at NUI Galway. This course allowed me to develop my interest in the biological sciences, with nine of the top ten biopharmaceutical companies in the world having operations in Ireland.

How has the scholarship made a difference to you?

The scholarship helped immensely in the payment of my tuition at NUI Galway and meant I could focus more on my studies for my final year. Thanks to the aid provided by the Galway Wind Park, I was able to put the money I earned on the weekends towards tuition for my Masters. All in all, this scholarship relieved much financial pressure and the accompanying anxiety during a year where everyone was under immense stress. I am immensely thankful to SSE, the GWP and the team for choosing me as a recipient of the scholarship.

What has the impact of the pandemic been on your learning?

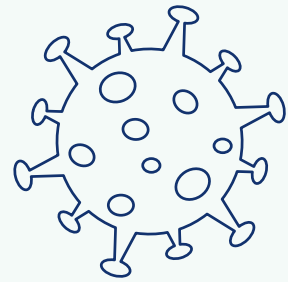
The pandemic has resulted in all our learning platforms going virtual. With being in final year, the majority of the course work is group assessments we had to get adjusted to zoom as the core method of interaction. Online learning provided some positive aspects including increased convenience, access to resources regardless of location and a reduction of costs.

This year the pandemic brought the challenge of working from home. We completed a business project via Microsoft Teams, and I finished my thesis on the COVID-19 variants using only a laptop. I am very fond of the times I've spent both in the lecture halls and performing musicals on stage with my friends. It is a bittersweet feeling to finish your degree in the playroom of your childhood home, but we roll with the punches and I wouldn't change any part of my experience.

What do you hope to do after university?

I have recently been offered a place on the International Masters Programme in Infectious Diseases and One Health (IDOH).

Coomacheo & Curragh Community Fund

Helping the vulnerable

Ionad Lae in Baile Mhúirne, Co. Cork, applied for funding as part of the Coomacheo Community Fund to help with the costs of the Meals on Wheels service required in lockdown. Most of the residents supported are in remote and isolated areas and the delivery of a daily meal is, for some, the only contact they get. The demand for the Meals on Wheels service increased significantly during lockdown. The team quickly mobilised so that up to 4,258 meals were delivered every month. For many of the recipients the service was their only engagement with the outside world and became vital to their well-being.

"Demand for our service is higher than it has ever been. Many of our residents live alone and have no other means of obtaining a hot meal. Providing much needed services such as Meals on Wheels, medical deliveries and care calls to the elderly, the club proved invaluable to the vulnerable and isolating members of the community. SSE Renewables supported the club through the funding of PPE, sanitiser and food supplies. Thanks to the hard work of club volunteers they were able to deliver much needed resources to the community members and showed true community spirit.

School Coronavirus Response Fund

€42,458 awarded in September 2020

Supporting children's safe return to the classroom

In August 2020 SSE Renewables launched a Schools Coronavirus Response Fund to support local schools around the Bindoo, Gartnaneane and Corneen Wind Farms in County Cavan and Mullananalt Wind Farm in County Monaghan. The funding was made quickly available, to enable schools to open safely in compliance with coronavirus measures in September 2020.

17 schools were awarded funding for coronavirus measures sharing in €42,458. The measures included

foggers, sanitisers and dispensers and cleaning products so that enhanced hygiene standards could be maintained. The funding also supported the need for additional social distance requirements and provided extra tables and chairs, plastic storage boxes for pupils' books and signage to ensure children followed the new distancing rules. The provision enabled children to continue to learn in a safe and engaging environment.

"Children have missed out on so much both educationally and socially, so supporting them on their return to the classroom is so important for us. Through the funding from SSE Renewables we were able to put in place the key safety measures required so the children could return to as normal an environment as possible."

GALWAY WIND PARK MAJOR PROJECT FUNDS

The Galway Wind Park Major Project Fund was shaped following consultation with local stakeholders and is part of the commitment from wind park owners SSE Renewables and Greencoat Renewables towards making a genuine and lasting difference to the Cloosh Valley. The fund successfully provided €300,000 investment to energy efficiency programmes in 2018. Following local consultation on fund priorities the second round of the fund opened for applications in January 2021.

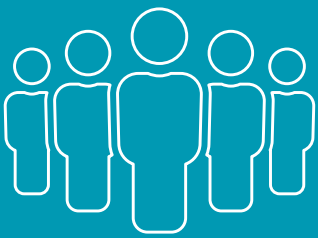
Galway Wind Park Major Projects Fund

Killannin Pitch Committee was awarded €47,000 to facilitate capital works at the club grounds to help increase the number of participants and the ground safety. The works include improvements to the pitch surfaces including drainage and astroturfing near the goals, erection of dugouts to provide shelter, LED scoreboard, portable goals for the underage levels and development of a new exercise area.



Once the capital works have been completed the committee intend to hold a fun day at the pitch to encourage new participants to experience the activities the club can offer. It is hoped the provision of the upgraded facilities will encourage new members as well as new community groups to utilise the area. The enhanced setting will provide an inclusive setting for the community as a whole. The club currently has 1,165 members and they hope the new investment will double the numbers in the next two years.

Killannin Pitch Committee is a forward-thinking club, with a proven track record in delivery. In addition to the funding provided by Galway Wind Park Major Projects Fund, the club have secured a Sports Capital Grant in excess of €50,000 showing their determination to complete the works.
