This Environmental Statement (ES), prepared in accordance with the Electricity Works (Environmental Impact Assessment) (Scotland) Regulations 2000 (as amended), accompanies an application (the Application) made by SSE Generation Ltd (the Applicant) to the Scottish Ministers for consent under Section 36 of the Electricity Act 1989, and deemed planning permission under the Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997, as amended, section 57 (2) to construct and operate a wind farm of up to 56MW at Gordonbush Estate, north-west of Brora in Sutherland.
